The Board of Studies of each department meets at regular intervals to consider this.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Regular class tests, special tutorial classes for weak and backward students, seminars, special lectures by renowned Professors from outside are arranged. Our students are also encouraged to participate in different programmes (eg. Quiz Contests) organized by outside institutions/other bodies.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

As it is understood that the one of the most important components of an autonomous college is its examination department, we also have, in our college, a very active and sensible Exam Cell. CCTV has been installed in the examination halls to ensure fair examinations. The students of the final semesters both in UG and PG classes are consulted before fixing the final semesters' examination schedules to avoid overlapping of the college exam days with the different competitive examinations where our students are supposed to appear. Exam Calendar is strictly adhered to in order to publish results on time.

6.3.4 Research and Development

The Research Committee has been constantly encouraging its teachers to undertake Major and Minor Research Projects. Those who are already engaged in such projects are provided with all supports. We further hope to provide them more space and better facilities after the completion of new Annex building.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Digitization process in the Library has been completed. Construction of New Annexe Building is under progress. A new hostel building has been constructed.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

Our teachers are constantly encouraged to participate in extension / collaborative activities with other Universities and Institutions in various capacities. Reputed professors from outside are invited to deliver talks. Some retired Professors with good teaching backgrounds are also serving this college at our invitations as college funded chair professors.

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

West Bengal College Service Commission and Government of West Bengal are constantly pursued to take steps to fill vacancies. As we have to depend on Government agencies for recruitment, we employ Part-time / Guest Lecturers in order to make-up for the deficiencies in human resources arising due to the delay in filling the vacancies in teaching posts.

There is no such formal association. But the departments and the hostel authorities maintain close contacts with the parents to apprise them of their wards' progress as well as the progress of the college. A parent teacher meeting was held in October 3, 2015.
