Proceedings of the IQAC held on 7 June, 2021

1. The proceedings of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.
2. Business arising and Action Taken Report :
 - a. The queries sent by NAAC as a part of Data Validation & Verification (DVV) were discussed with all the concerned faculty members on 25th March 2021 and subsequently responses against the queries were sent to NAAC.
 - b. UG and PG Semester 1 examinations were conducted as per the schedule.
 - c. Classes for UG and PG semesters 2 have begun after a week of the examinations were held.
3. Announcement of results of 5th Sem UG and 3rd Sem PG :

Vice Principal Maharaj announced the results of 5th Semester UG and 3rd Semester PG. He mentioned that all students have passed in all papers.
4. Examination dates and other related matters of UG Semesters 6, 4 and 2 and PG Semesters 4 and 2 :

Principal Maharaj Proposed tentative dates of examinations, completion of classes, submission of answer scripts, commencement of classes for next semesters etc. After discussions following dates were fixed. However, Principal reported that for last semesters students will be asked to note the dates so that these do not clash with any of their PG / Ph.D. entrance examinations dates. It was further mentioned that examinations will be conducted online as was done in last semester provided any further changes are not imposed by statutory authorities.

 - o Date of last class : 30 June 2021

5. Any Other Matter :

- a. Principal requested to all faculty members to kindly send a report of the webinars conducted during last one year.
- b. He further mentioned that for AQAR 2020-21 session, data submission in prescribed format will be requested after one month.
- c. He informed that the college has housed the Safe Home and is offering an online tutorial class. Apart from that large scale relief works for YAAS affected people are being conducted by the ashrama where three monastic members have actively taken part.
- d. A group of our students along with the college authority has helped 10 families with financial help during second surge co covid pandemic.
- e. Principal apprised the members that at the backdrop of the cancellation of several qualifying board examinations in class 12 level, we need to ponder over the admission procedures for the session 20221-22 shortly.



Minutes of the Meeting
of
Internal Quality Assurance Cell
held on 19 June 2021

Swami Shastrajnananda, Principal of the college, was in the Chair.

1. Confirmation of the proceedings of the last meeting :

- a) The proceedings of the last meeting was read and confirmed.
- b) Swami Shastrajnananda, Principal of the college, presented the following **Action Taken Report (ATR)** on the discussions and/or resolutions noted in the proceedings:
 - a. Successfully completed the application process for NIRF and answered all their queries. The result is awaited.
 - b. Constituted a standing committee for academic council.
 - c. In response to suggestions from IQAC, a new ICT Maintainer formed to take care of all the online programmes conducted in and its various departments.
 - d. Honours courses in Philosophy and Political Science have been started with 10 and 11 students respectively.
 - e. A new online value education programme is also initiated by the NSS wing and till date 10 Saturday sessions have been organised.

2. Commencement of the next semester :

The Principal informed that the departmental faculty members and the administration discussed in details in starting the next semester classes as early as possible. However, keeping in mind the ensuing NAAC visit and allied preparations, the semester classes may be required to be adjusted in such a manner that the regular teaching-learning gets hampered as less as possible. The Principal further informed that to keep the quality and continuity of the teaching-learning process, each department has been requested to chalk out a clear blue print for this particular period.

Members appreciated the initiatives.

3. Proposal for the Procedure for the Admission to UG and PG programmes for the session 2021-22

Principal informed that the college has initiated the process regarding the admission to UG and PG programmes for the session 2021-22. Members discussed in details regarding this. It has been observed that as in this year the plus two level examinations have not been conducted, hence some sort of screening test is necessary to keep the quality

benchmark of the student input in this college. The IQAC, thus, forwards this recommendation to the Academic Council / Standing Committee of the Academic Council for further deliberations and final decision.

4. 3rd Cycle NAAC accreditation process : Status Report

The IQAC Coordinator reported that the DVV process is almost complete. He further informed that there were some issues with the DVV partner where the college could not accept the decision taken after DVV. The college raised the issues with IMS (Issue Management System) of NAAC and expects that the issues will be resolved at the earliest. He also informed his expectation over the possible Peer Team Visit before Puja Vacation.

Members expressed their pleasure over the progression in NAAC Re-accreditation process.

5. Any Other Matter :

- i. Principal Maharaj reported that 192 students in total were admitted in the UG programme this year the same number for the PG programme is 54 and for PhD 4. The pass percentage in the last terminal semester was 100. The percentage of students' progression from UG to PG is 96 with that from PG to Ph.D. or other courses being 56, a bit lower than expected. It was decided to take all attempts to increase this number and to counsel the students in the given issue.
- ii. More encouragement are sought to initiate some professional courses other than those planned to prepare students for government jobs. An increased publicity for PhD courses was suggested by others and the proposal was and accepted. 24 research scholars are accommodated at present in the College campus. As an adherence to proper rules and regulation with respect to research activities is given the utmost importance, the capacity constraint of the laboratory space is seen as the main bottleneck to increase the number of research scholars.
- iii. As UG students often move on the path of academic progression, it was decided that the focus should be more on the improvement of the placement opportunities of PG students. Principal maharaj reported that 6 students from Chemistry and 6 from computer science were placed successfully last year.
- iv. Principal maharaj informed the committee that 24 academic webinars (7 of them being of international level) have been organized as a part of the diamond jubilee celebration of our College. This trend is hoped to be continued even after this celebration is concluded. One seminar was organized by IQAC regarding the NAAC accreditation process in which 4 different organizers of NAAC were

present to deliver their speeches. The director of NAAC sent a taped video lecture which was presented too. The whole function was a success in terms of the huge response it received from different faculty members from others Colleges.

- v. Principal maharaj told the committee that during the diamond jubilee celebration of the College, started on 3rd august 2020, 4 different galleries have been opened. These include the thoroughly renovated Shakespeare gallery, a photo history archive of the College, a mini-sized museum for the study of Bengal folk culture and the Zero gallery constructed with active help from BITM. It was decided that the archives may be opened for outsiders. It was planned to intimate different educational institutions once the pandemic passes over and to request them to send their students to visit these facilities.
- vi. Principal maharaj reported that already three books have been published under the publication of Vivekananda centre for Research and they are "Pingala Chhandasutrer Ganit", "Shunya Shudhu Shunya Noi" and "Much 'Ado about Nothing", each authored by Dr. Parthasarathi Mukhopadhyay.
- vii. Principal maharaj informed the committee that there have been 11 collaborating activities in organizing seminars recently, 3 for research activities and 2 others for extension activities, all within the national level. 3 MoUs have been signed. The MoU with **The Institute of Nanoscience and Technology (INST)**, Mohali has helped 3 of our students to do their internship there at with free food and lodging facilities. A MoU is signed with **TCG Lifesciences Private Limited** for collaboration in quality research in Chemistry and arranging internship for students. The last of the MoUs is with **Ramakrishna Mission Vidyamandira, Belur**, with the motto of sharing of some expensive instruments of both the institutes for research and sharing faculty resources in subjects like Philosophy and Political Science. It was decided that the college should explore the possibilities of signing MoUs with different academic institutions of national repute.
- viii. **Research Activities**
The committee was informed by the Principal maharaj that Presently there are 4 ongoing research projects in the College, with two new ones added this year. Citation index of the publications is now a tad below 4 while the H index stands at 12 which is way above average for an autonomous college. PhD programme in the dept. of English would start as soon as the UGC criterion for having at least two teachers with PhD in the department is fulfilled shortly. Prof. Jagaadish Chandra Mahato was given a Fellowship for post doctoral research from one

German University. The committee encouraged the proposal for purchasing the Nuclear Magnetic Resonance spectroscope and decided to put forward this proposal to the appropriate authorities to facilitate it and advised to explore the avenues to raise funds required for it.

ix. **Value education and online free coaching**

The following facts were reported by the Principal maharaj. There has been a Value Education session called "awakening India", a medical camp under the College NSS wing which organized 4 such camps in the rural areas of 24 Parganas, 1 blood donation camp in the College campus (which won the Netaji Subhas Chandra Award, 2021, from the prestigious Voluntary Blood Donation Association), and a safe home organized in the Gouranga Bhavan in the Ashrama campus to provide beds for Covid patients (with some patients being still there on this date). This safe home facility is planned to be continued in case a third wave of Covid-19 occurs eventually. The NSS wing, in collaboration with the teachers from Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya has organized free online coaching classes for students studying in class 9-12. Number of registered students initially exceeded 40,000 which dwindled after the screening test.

- x. The committee was informed that regular classes are being held via online mode. Online feed backs from students are also collected to maintain the standard of teaching unhindered by the ongoing pandemic. College administration met with students from two different sessions already. Student mentoring is done on a continual basis. It was decided that the classes be continued in online mode till we receive any clear order from the state government regarding the opening of the college campuses.
- xi. Some practical classes for PG students and some UG 3rd semester students of Physics and Chemistry (who stayed back in the hostel after each providing an undertaking) were arranged physically during the period when the pandemic was a bit less severe. It was decided that this should be done for the next semester too if the situation permits.
- xii. The committee was appraised regarding the Convocation that was held on 6th March. Prof. Sanghamitra Bandyopadhyay, director ISI, was present as the Chief Guest.
- xiii. Suggestions for initiating some professional courses came from some external members. It was stated that some endeavors in this regard have already been made to introduce courses on videography and environmental activities. But the pandemic had played a spoilsport. Plans to arrange coaching classes for WBCS aspirants were also stalled due to the same reason. Decision regarding this to be taken after the situation normalises.
- xiv. Suggestions regarding creation of virtual labs for science programmes are well received. Blended mode of education (60-40) is still in the process of discussion.

- xv. The Standing Committee of Academic Council has had 9 meetings mostly regarding publication of different semester results and other related agenda. Exams are still being conducted via online mode and will be continued for the time being, unless anything happens otherwise. It was resolved that Semester 4 and Semester 6 exams were supposed to start between 17th to 26th July and practical exams would be over by 30th July. Results are to be published by 9th August, 2021. Classes for Semester 5 was planned to be over by 31st Dec. while that date for the 2nd Semester of both UG and PG was tentatively fixed at 15th Jan.
- xvi. SSR for NAAC accreditation is already submitted and the answers against all their subsequent queries too sent for data verification and validation process. The College has raised some objections against their evaluation in some of the answered criteria. Some of them are accepted too. The peer team visit was planned to be arranged by September following which the application for renewal for autonomy may be submitted.
- xvii. Principal Maharaj informed the committee that one Waste Plastic Recycling Programme had been arranged in the campus, and a small portion of a road (around 1500 sq ft) in the campus was constructed with the help of tiles made solely of recycled waste of plastics. Extension plans of such activities were encouraged by the IQAC.



1. The proceedings of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.
2. Business arising and action taken report:
UG- 4th, 6th semester and PG- 4th semester examinations took place on time
3. Declaration of the results of UG 6th Sem and PG 4th Sem :
The results for the UG- 6th semester and the PG- 4th semester was announced by the Vice Principal. All Students passed except for one from the computer science department who remained absent for the exams due to health issues.
4. Discussion on the admission 2021 – already started
Dr. Dilip Sahoo suggested that Viva test sessions could be conducted even in the next session. He further suggested that even after admission of the newly admitted students, we can conduct viva voce sessions more frequently. In this regard, the Principal suggested that departments can make decisions and develop plans as part of continuous assessment.
Dr Parthasarathi Mukherjee suggested that a possible bridge course may be required for UG 1st year Mathematics students who are not equipped with sufficient knowledge base. The Principal told that it is a good suggestion. The Department may go ahead if they feel such need.
5. NAAC Peer Team Visit and AQAR Matters
The Principal discussed on the possible NAAC Peer Team Visit dates that the college is required to suggest. After discussions three sets of dates were decided and the Principal told that he will inform it to NAAC authority through their web system.
He further mentioned that in September the IQAC will conduct workshops on Peer Team Visit and in that workshop Swami Bhudevanandaji will be invited to guide the Departments. There may be two such workshops.
For NAAC and AQAR purpose, the Principal requested all the members to preserve:
i) Admission data of outgoing students into other colleges for higher studies. ii) Project works and reports.

6. Other Matters:

There was nothing specific under this agenda.

- 1) The proceedings of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.
- 2) Business arising and action taken report: As discussed earlier, all reports and data of outgoing students are preserved for the present year's AQAR submission
- 3) Reopening of the college following covid protocol and government notification :
It was decided that for the time being, mandatory offline classes will be held for practical courses of Physics and Chemistry of UG 2nd and 3rd Year and PG 2nd yr.
 - a) For Non- Lab and other departments, if the Department or any any particular Faculty Member thinks that they are ready to conduct offline classes for a particular batch of students, the college will make arrangements for the students of that subject and batch.
 - b) If students experience difficulty accessing the internet, they can stay in the hostel with the permission of the Principal.

Precautions to maintain:

- Wearing a mask and the carrying of sanitizer to be mandatory.
- Regular Thermal readings to be made
- A 24 bed quarantine room to be made ready in Gauranga Bhavan.
- c) The Pandemic situation and the offline-online hybrid teaching-learning system, thus introduced now, will be reviewed on 15th December, 2021 before starting full offline mode classes for all students of all years.

Responses from other departments:

- **English:** Since it will be troublesome to conduct hybrid classes (online and offline) together, it will be better to bring all batches of their department or none.
- **Statistics:** Since Group study is beneficial in preparing for JAM, thus can they be allowed to stay.
Principal: Yes, the residential facility is already open for the interested ones.
- **Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics and Computer Science:** They will discuss it and will inform accordingly.
- **Philosophy and Political Science :** As almost all students are living in the hostel, of-fline classes may be held, however, things will be reviewed later.





Agenda 1 (a) : The proceedings of the last meeting (No 14) dated 12th June 2021 were read and confirmed.

Agenda 1(b) : The house was informed that the moot issues of the aforesaid Meeting were taken up for compliance and onward for further movement.

Agenda 2 : Reporting on the activities of IQAC : The IQAC Coordinator presented the following summary of the activities of IQAC during the interim period (June 12, 2021 – March 1, 2022) :

I. NAAC Accreditation :

IQAC was mostly busy with the NAAC accreditation process till the first week of October, 2022. It held several discussions/ meetings with different stakeholders of the college and put all efforts to achieve a good grade for the college. It also organized a mock peer team visit just before the NAAC peer team visit.

II. Academic-Administrative Activities :

a. CAS related workshop

A workshop for the assistant professors of the college related to their CAS was held on January 22, 2022.

b. Webinars aimed at general awareness enhancement

IQAC organized two "Diamond Jubilee Commemorative Webinars" aimed at the enhancement of general awareness of the students, viz.

i. Wonders of the Night Sky (jointly organized with the Department of Mathematics of the college in collaboration with Sky Watchers Association on July 05, 2022, and delivered by Dipankar Dey, Asst. Prof., Gurudas college, Kolkata).

ii. Statistics: Impact of Covid-19, Challenges and Future (delivered by Dr G. P. Samanta, CSI-cum-Secretary, MoSPI, GoI).

c. Webinar on Intellectual Property Rights

A webinar on "Intellectual Property Rights", jointly organized with the Patent Office, GOI, Kolkata, was organized on February 14, 2022.

d. Orientation programme for students related to examination rules

An online orientation programme, related to examination rules, for the students of Semester-I of UG and PG was held on February 14, 2022. Br. Anandachaitanya,

the monastic member-coordinator of Controller of Examinations' department, explained the rules and regulations of examinations of the college before the students.

e. Workshop related to the Academic and Administrative Audit and Autonomy Renewal Visit by the Peer Team from University of Calcutta

A workshop for the necessary preparations to be taken by different departments, units, cells, office, and accounts, in order to ensure a smooth and successful academic and administrative audit in connection to the renewal of autonomy of the college was held on February 8 and 9, 2022.

f. Academic and Administrative Audit

IQAC arranged an Academic and Administrative Audit which was done by a Calcutta University nominated Peer Team on February 10, 2022.

g. NIRF ranking

IQAC initiated the data submission process to NIRF and assisted the principal in this process.

h. Preparation of the academic calendar, examination schedule and conduction of online/ offline classes

IQAC has been actively involved in the preparation of academic calendar, in fixing the examination schedule, in deciding the modalities of holding classes in online mode and as well as in offline mode wherever it was possible taking into consideration of all the advisories and directives from the state and union governments, UGC and ensuring the maintenance of the covid safety norms.

i. Bridge Courses

Some of the academic departments felt that some sort of "bridge courses" might be required for the newly admitted students as those students did not have regular lessons in their school days due to the lockdown imposed following the onset of the covid pandemic. IQAC encouraged this proposal and left it to the respective departments to take necessary actions if they considered that any "bridge course" was necessary.

j. Submission of AQAR

IQAC has already taken initiatives to prepare the AQAR for the academic session 2020-2021.

Agenda 3 : Change in the College Administration :

The Coordinator informed that Swami Shastrajnanandaji, the erstwhile Principal of the college, has been transferred to Ramakrishna Mission Saradapha for taking charge of the Secretary of that centre and that he has been succeeded by Swami Ekachittananda, who has assumed his new responsibility of the Principal of the College on 16th of January 2022.

Subsequently, an appeal for extension of autonomy (3rd cycle) has been forwarded to the Secretary, UGC.

The IQAC members expressed satisfaction at the progress of the autonomy renewal process.

Agenda 8 : Implementation of Memo No. 89-Edn (CS)/10M-32/2021 : Resumption of classes in offline mode :

The Principal informed that in consonance with Memo. No. 89-Edn (CS)/10M-32/2021, issued by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of West Bengal, the college has started resumption of classes in offline mode maintaining the SOP suggested in the memo mentioned above. The Principal informed that the Department of Cultural Affairs of the college has recently introduced Add-on Certificate courses on Devotional Songs, Classical Vocal Music, Bengali Recitation, Tabla, Pakhoaj, Violin, Flute, Guitar and Vedic Chanting while the Vivekananda Centre for Research has initiated add-on certificate courses on 'Translation Studies' & 'Spoken English'. Classes for the courses conducted by the Department of Cultural Affairs are being held in the newly inaugurated 'Nivedita Music Room' in Brahmananda Bhavana, he added.

Resolved that the action of the Principal in this regard be ratified.

b) Introduction of End-programme online feedback from students of the outgoing batches on teaching-learning and other academic issues :

The Principal apprised the members of the introduction of a new scheme on 'End-programme online feedback' from the outgoing UG and PG students. This will be in consonance with the NAAC guidelines on conductance of the 'Student Satisfaction Survey', he further pointed out.

Resolved that the action of the Principal in this regard be ratified.

c) Introduction of Departmental Open House for receiving current students' feedback on teaching-learning and other academic issues :

The Principal informed that following a discussion in the meeting of the Teachers' Council held on 22 January 2022 it has been decided that Departmental Open Houses will be conducted by each department in each semester to receive feedback from the current students. This will help in enhancement of the quality of teaching & learning, he opined.

Resolved that the action of the Principal in this regard be ratified.

d) Formation of the 'Vidyarthi Sabha' (Students' Council) :

The Principal reported that in agreement with the NAAC guidelines, a 'Students' Council' ('Vidyarthi Sabha') is needed to be formed in the college. He further informed that the issue has already been discussed in the meeting of the Teachers' Council held on 22 January 2022 and a draft constitution has been placed, in which it has been suggested that

- I) The student members will be nominated by monastics and teachers.
- II) Other than students, the council will include monastics as well as the teachers.
- III) There will be a post of 'Secretary', two posts of 'Assistant Secretaries' and one of 'Chief Student Advisor' in the council.
- IV) The council will have a number of subcommittees for assistance in day-to-day affairs of the college.

Resolved that the formation of the 'Vidyarthi Sabha' be ratified.

e) Introduction of Students' Colloquium & Teachers' Colloquium :

The Principal reported that following discussion held in the meeting of the Teachers' Council held on 22 January 2022, the college has decided to introduce Students' Colloquium, which will undoubtedly improve the skill of communication and presentation of the students. The Seminar Subcommittee of the Students' Council will organize these colloquia. Similarly, Teachers' Colloquium will also be held in regular intervals.

Resolved that the introduction of Students' Colloquium & Teachers' Colloquium be ratified.

Agenda 11 : Signing of MoU(s) :

The Principal stated that Memorandum of Understanding has been signed with International Steam Research (ISR). This MoU will facilitate the college in the following areas :

- a) Internship of outgoing UG/PG students.
- b) Placement after successful completion of internship.

Agenda 12 : Outreach activities : (a) Relief, (b) Blood Donation Camp, (c) Online Personality Development Programme, (d) Online Coaching classes :

The Principal apprised the IQAC members of the following outreach activities (since the last meeting of the cell :

- (a) **Post-Covid Relief** : Students, teachers, members of non-teaching staff and monastic members of the college have taken part in relief work post Covid pandemic and 'Yaas' disaster over the last six months. Dry ration, eatables, sanitizers, surgical masks etc. have been distributed in the following places of the of 24 Pgs (South) : Kakdwip, Patharpratima, Namkhana, GhoRamara, Sagardwip, Gosaba & Najat.
- (b) **Covid 'Safe Home'** : A 'Safe Home' was set up in Sri Gouranga Bhavana on 31 May 2022 whereat a fairly large number of patients of the locality received treatment. As per the Government order, the 'Safe Home' was closed on 20 September 2022.

- (c) **Blood Donation Camp** : A Blood Donation Camp was organized by the NSS wing of the college inside the college premises on 19 September 2021, in which the number of donors was 83.
- (d) **Online Personality Development Programme** : 'Awakening the Youth', an online personality development programme, has been conducted from Nov-December 2020 to June 2021. Several monks of Ramakrishna order took part in it. On an average, 200 students attended each session.
- (e) **Online Coaching classes** : Online coaching classes for students of standard 9-12 from 1st June 2021 to July 2021 and then from October 2021 to December 2021, organized by the NSS wing of the college in collaboration with the IQAC and has been successfully completed.

The IQAC took note of the outreach activities and commended the members of all the units of the college for the service rendered to the suffering countrymen.

Agenda 13 : Cultural & Sports Calendar for 2021-22 :

After a brief discussion, it was decided that the proposal would be placed before the Examination Committee and then the resolution of the committee could be forwarded to the AC & the IQAC for ratification.

- (b) **Convocation 2021** : The Principal reported that the 10th Convocation of the college was held on 23rd December 2021. While Prof Amlan J. Pal, Director, UGC-DAE CSR delivered the Convocation Address, Prof Ashis Chattopadhyay, Pro-Vice Chancellor (Academic), University of Calcutta presided over the occasion and conferred the degrees to the graduating students.

The IQAC members expressed satisfaction at the timely conductance of the convocation ceremony.

- (c) **Submission of AQAR 2020-21** : The Principal informed that the college is now set to submit the AQAR for the academic session 2020-21 to NAAC, the last date of submission, as per the notification, being 31st March 2022.



- ii) Prof. Parthasarathi Mukhopadhyay, Department of Mathematics, has delivered an invited talk on Ancient Indian Mathematics in an International Conference held on 25th February, 2022, organized by the Ministry of Culture, Govt. of India.
- iii) Sriman Subham Kumar Singh, a UG III Computer Science (Hons.) student and an NCC cadet, has been nominated for the prestigious Governor's Medal for his outstanding performance in NCC over the span of last 3 years.
- iv) A group of students of the college has taken part in a cultural competition organized by 'Yuvavani, Kolkata' on 14th February 2022, as a part of the observance of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav'. Out of them, Sriman Sagnik Banerjee, PG I English, has been picked up for the State-level competition, slated on 2nd March 2022.
