1. INTRODUCTION—AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Established in 1960 by the Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math, this autonomous Residential College in the idyllic setting at Narendrapur in greater Kolkata aims at fulfilling Swami Vivekananda's vision of education. It provides both academic and spiritual training to young men hailing largely from West Bengal with a smattering of students from Assam, Tripura, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, and Maharashtra.

Currently the college offers 13 undergraduate (UG) programmes for Bachelors' degree (B.A. / B.Sc. Honours) and 5 post-graduate (PG) programmes for Masters' degree (M.A. / M.Sc.). The medium of instruction is English for subjects other than Bangla, Hindi and Sanskrit. Undergraduate programmes include Bangla, English, History, Philosophy, Political Science, and Sanskrit for B.A. Honours, and Chemistry, Computer Science, Economics, Life Sciences, Mathematics Physics, Statistics for B.Sc. Honours. Post-graduate programmes are offered in English, Sanskrit, Chemistry, Computer Science, and Physics.

Besides, through its 'Vivekananda Centre for Research' the institution runs Ph.D. programmes under the University of Calcutta in Chemistry, Computer Science, and Physics.
